This is a Double-Run format trial, you may 'swap out' jumping classes on Friday.

FEO Entries will be accepted. Day-to-Day Move Ups will be allowed.

Entries close at 5 pm on Tuesday prior to the date of the trial or when trial fills.

You will receive a verification of your entry upon receipt.

THIS TRIAL IS A PART OF THE NADAC REGIONALS CIRCUIT

The Regional Event has no bearing on the Open, Novice, or Intro level courses – Only Elite Regular.

Regionals Scoring takes place along side the normal trial scoring, so if you are only coming for a regular trial weekend, this will have no impact on your runs or Q's either!

In addition to scoring Elite Regular for the Regionals, a couple of new classes may be offered at the end of the day for testing. These classes will be offered "Entry Fee Free!", no Q's will be awarded.

AWARDS

Placement ribbons will be awarded to first through eighth place in each jump height for each class, except Chances which is a pass/fail class. Skilled and Proficient categories will be combined for placement ribbons. A purple qualifying ribbon shall be given for each qualifying round.

INTRO LEVEL

Intro level courses are shorter than Novice. The only Intro level class with weaves will be Intro Weavers and it will have one set of 6 poles; no other Intro classes will present weave poles. The Intro level will have no tunnel/contact discriminations.

The Intro level is a full titling level with the basic titles at 30 points, Outstanding Performance at 60 points and Superior Performance at 100 points for Chances, Jumpers, Tunnelers, Weavers, Hoopers, Touch N Go, and Barrelers. For Regular the basic title is at 30 points, Outstanding Performance is at 100 points and Superior Performance is at 200 points.

THIS IS A CONTAINERIZED TRIAL

FOOD/TOYS IN POCKET: Food or a small noiseless toy may be carried into the ring in your pocket provided it is contained in a ziplock bag or small container such as a pill bottle. The container cannot be visible in the ring nor within 10 feet of the ring. You cannot indicate to your dog that you have this item on you i.e. patting your pocket. You are not allowed to remove the container until you are at least 10 feet outside the ring. All food and toys must be contained at the trial and none can be left lying about loose. **This policy has been implemented to reduce the possibility of dogs fighting over loose food or toys, diminish dogs dragging their handlers back to their crates (or wherever they left their food), and to lessen the amount of insects that are around loose food.**

IMPORTANT!

Please check your dog's NADAC registration number on your trial confirmation as soon as you receive it; also, please check the copy of the results posted at the trial. You should report any errors to the Trial Secretary immediately.

NADAC records trial results as they are submitted by the host clubs/groups. The individual trial results submitted by the club are uploaded to <http://NADAC.com> within two weeks after the NADAC office receives them from the club. Please accept the responsibility to review those results, and check that your registration number and qualifying points, as reported by the club, are correct. If you find an error in the reporting of your dog's qualifying points or registration number, please contact the host club. The host club is responsible for correcting any errors and informing NADAC.

Levels. Points earned at a higher level of a class, prior to the completion of the lower level title, will not be banked by NADAC for future use. If a dog earns points in a level of a class that they are not eligible to title in, those points will not be added to the dog's records.

EVERYTHING YOU COULD POSSIBLY WANT TO KNOW ABOUT JUMP HEIGHTS

Dogs must enter the Veterans Division after their 9th birthday.

Dogs must enter the Skilled Category, Veterans Division after their 12th birthday.

SKILLED CATEGORY

When entering the Skilled Category, all dogs must jump 4" lower than their Proficient, Standard Division jump height requires.

NON-JUMPING CLASSES: VETERAN OR DISABLED HANDLER

Handlers who are 60 years or older, or who have a disability that restricts mobility, may choose to enter the non-jumping classes as a Veteran Handler and receive 10% more standard course time. This option is for Veteran/Disabled handlers in the non-jumping classes only. The Veteran/Disabled Handler division is designed for handlers who, due to age or impairment, are mobility limited and need extra time to guide their canine partners through an agility course. When entering as a Veteran/Disabled Handler, you must enter all dogs in all classes for the entire trial in this Division and must jump 4" lower than your Proficient Standard Division jump height requires. In the non-jumping classes, dogs will be scored and placed with their Standard Division jump height.

Dogs which require measuring:

- Dogs in the Proficient Category, Novice, Open or Elite jumping 4", 8", 12" or 16"

Dogs which do not need to be measured:

- Dogs jumping 16" in the Veteran or Junior Handler Division
 - Dogs jumping 20" and 20+
 - Dogs in the Skilled Category
 - Dogs with a permanent height card
 - Dogs listed on the Height Exemption List

INTRO LEVEL:

Dogs entered at the intro level may jump at any height below or equal to their Standard Proficient jump height. 0 inches is not considered a valid jump height.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

Below is a brief summary of NADAC rules. Please refer to www.nadac.com for a full explanation of all NADAC rules and up to date information.

Please note that NADAC trials should provide a safe and fun environment for both exhibitors and their dogs. Aggressive dogs will not be tolerated and will be excused from the trial.

The show committee has the right to refuse any entry. Anyone not currently in good standing with NADAC will not be allowed to enter this trial.

No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reasons of riots, civil disturbances, fire, acts of God, public emergency, an act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.

Checks not honored by the bank do not constitute a valid entry fee. There be a \$25.00 service charge for bank returned checks.

**Dog must be registered and have a valid registration number before entries will be accepted.

HOSPITALITY:

Friday night a group of us will be visiting a local establishment for food and beverages following the completion of the runs.

Saturday & Sunday we offer complimentary small pastries, coffee and juice at the start of the day. We typically break for lunch and ask for a \$4 donation to cover the cost of food and supplies. The menu varies depending on the weather. We will announce menus in the trial instructions a few days prior to the event.

Saturday night social: We prepare an entree & side for all guests. You may bring a side dish, dessert, appetizers, or beverages if you like, or just feel free to join us as a guest for food, fun, and friendship! All we ask is that you let us know if you are planning on attending so we can prepare adequate food for the group.

We have a 60 foot by 80 foot barn next to the rings which can be used for isolated / sheltered crating. Crating and parking is also available ringside. Shade is minimal ringside, so please bring along sunshade or an EZ Up to keep your dog comfortable. Please remember that NADAC does not allow your dog to be "tethered" anywhere on the property so you must bring along a crate or x-pen where you dog can be contained. Club rules prohibit the use of shock collars, prong collars, and / or choke chains while on the property. We always have cooling pools and a garden hose available.

AGREEMENT

The person who signs this agreement represents that he/she is authorized to enter into this agreement on behalf of both exhibitor and the owner of entered dog. In consideration of acceptance of this entry:

1. As used here NADAC means North American Dog Agility Council, its members, officers, directors, employees, show chairs, show committees and agents.
2. As used here K9 Corps Agility includes CJR Ventures, LLC, Jeffrey Riedl, Cheryl Riedl, members of the K9 Corps Dog Agility Club, its' officers, employees, contractors, and volunteers.
3. Exhibitor/owner, agree to abide by the rules and regulations of NADAC and any other rules and regulations appearing in the premium for this event.
4. Exhibitor/owner certify that the entered dog is not a hazard to persons, dogs or property and that the entered dog's rabies vaccination is current in accordance with the requirement of the state in which the dog resides.
5. Exhibitor/owner acknowledge all hazards presented by the event and the event premises, including but not limited to, the condition of the floors, stairways, halls, lighting, security measures or lack of, electrical appliances, fitting, show rings, parking areas and the presence of unfamiliar animals and people; exhibitor and owner assume the risk of any harm arising from these.
6. Exhibitor/owner release NADAC (Including NADAC officers directors, employees and members), K-9 Corps Agility (including officers, directors, employees, and volunteers) and will defend them and hold them harmless from all present and future loss, injury, damage, claims, demands and liabilities involving the entered dog, the event or event premises. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing hold harmless provisions, exhibitor/owner hereby specifically assume sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify and save aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expenses (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties for damages because of bodily injuries, including death, at any time in consequence of my (our) participation in this event, howsoever such injury or death may be caused and whether or not the same may have been caused or may have been alleged to have been caused by negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees or agents or any other persons.

ENTRY FEES:

Entry fees are determined by POSTMARK ON THE ENVELOPE. The earlier you enter, the lower your rate.

- Entries postmarked PRIOR TO April 4, 2018 will be priced at \$10 per run.
- Entries postmarked PRIOR TO April 20, 2018 will be priced at \$12 per run.
- Entries postmarked April 21st or later will be priced at \$14 per run.

Volunteer workers at each trial receive **K9 Corps Ca\$h** which can be used for lunch, merchandise, lessons, ring time, and up to ½ of entry fees for future trials.

DAY OF SHOW ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED UP TO 30 MINUTES PRIOR TO THE FIRST RUN OF THE DAY PRICED AT \$16 PER RUN.

Please note – if you enter even ONE run per dog prior to the trial, your "per run rate" will hold good for Day of Show additions.

DIRECTIONS:

The best way to find us is by using the “Directions” feature of Google Maps. Some GPS units will not recognize the addressing system here in Outagamie County.

In general, we are located about ¼ mile east of a roundabout at the intersection of Highway 76 and County Road O. We're North of Greenville, east of Hortonville, northwest of Appleton.

FROM THE NORTHEAST OR SOUTH (Green Bay, Oshkosh, Milwaukee):

- Take Interstate 41 to the WI Highway 15 (OO - Northland Avenue) exit.
- Proceed west on WI 15 to WI Highway 76 in Greenville, then turn right.
- You will continue north to the roundabout at County O, right on O to the third property on your right.

FROM THE NORTHWEST (Wausau, Minneapolis)

- Take I-94 to WI Highway 29 Eastbound.
- Follow 29 East to Highway 45.
- South on 45 through the community of New London to Mill St. (WI Highway 15).
- Turn left on Mill Street and proceed southeast past the community of Hortonville and in to Greenville until you come to the traffic signal at WI Highway 76.
- Turn left at WI 76 and continue north to the roundabout at County O, right on O to the third property on your right.

FROM THE EAST OR WEST (Manitowoc, Stevens Point)

Take US 10 toward the Fox Cities and exit at WI Highway 76 northbound.

Follow WI 76 through Greenville and continue to the roundabout at County O, right on O to the third property on your right.

FROM THE HOTELS IN APPLETON

- Proceed west on College Avenue (County CA) until you reach the airport.
- Turn right on CB, then left on WI Highway 15 which is the end of the road.
- Proceed west on WI 15 to WI Highway 76 in Greenville, then turn right.
